## Operating Areas of ORCDG in Afghanistan





---

**Food Distribution Project to 109 vulnerable families**

---

The project benefitted a total of 109 HHs (846 individuals) which encompassed different groups of the community including vulnerable groups such as people with disabilities, child headed households, women headed households, pregnant and breastfeeding women.



---

**Provision of Ramadhan Food Boxes to impoverished families in Doshi Baghlan**

---

The project provided support to a total of 165 HHs (1217 individuals) including children, women, elderly people, people with disabilities and other vulnerable groups.





---

**Sacrificing 24 cows in Baghlan through Qurbani Program**

---

The project provided around 5593 individuals (799 households) in Baghlan Province with sacrificed animal meat during Eid days.



---

**Afghanistan Earthquake Emergency Response - Paktika**

---

In order to provide emergency relief support for the earthquake affected population in Gayan district of Paktika Province, ORCDG with funding from AFH assisted 60 disaster afflicted families with emergency food, non-food, and dignity shelter items.



---

**CR-ORCD Afghanistan School Feeding and Ramadhan Food Packs Programme**

---

Improved Attendance, additional registration, Reduced drop-out rate, Improved nutritional status of the children, Improved academic performance of the children, Improved completion/graduation rate, Improved completion/graduation rate for girls, Improved physical development of the students during

their education, Food security for vulnerable families during Ramadhan, Reduced hunger and improved nutritional status, Improved household economics, Improved participation of children in education.

School Meals are delivered in selected governmental schools (4 schools, 2236 students total) in Kabul Province every school day (Sat-Thur.) of the national academic calendar starting from 23 Mar 2022 for a period of 1 year up to 30th March 2023.



---

### Construction of 123 Deep Tube Wells in Afghanistan

---

The project was successfully implemented in six districts of Baghlan and Kunduz Provinces. Out of the total of 123 wells, 63 wells completed in Baghlan and 60 were constructed in Kunduz province. The project will have long term impacts on the decrease of water borne diseases as well ensure the dignity and safety of women and children in the target areas.



---

## Afghanistan Shelter Rehabilitation

---

To construct two room shelters for 10 Earthquake-affected households in Gayan, Paktika. The project will directly benefit 84 individuals providing them with a safe, secure and clean shelter for living.



---

## Winterization support to vulnerable families in Kabul, Baghlan and Kunduz Provinces

---

To address the needs of the vulnerable population during winter in Kabul, Baghlan, and Kunduz. The project implemented in the target areas within this winter and provided 310 households with cash aid (USD 265/HH).





---

**Flood Response Project to affected people in Logar**

---

To assist and promote the dignity of flood- affected population in Logar providing lifesaving support in the form of food, and NFI. ORCDG distributed Food and Non-Food items packages to 210 flood affected families in Logar Province.



---

**Construction of 45 deep Tube Wells in Afghanistan (Baghlan)**

---

To improve the drinking water quality in the target areas and help improve the health condition of the communities. The project is currently being implemented in four districts of Baghlan Province. The project will have long term impacts on the decrease of water borne diseases as well ensure the dignity and safety of women and children in the target areas.



---

**Emergency Food, Hygiene and WASH Project for flood affected population in Logar**

---

Through this project, the emergency needs of the flood affected people in Logar province was satisfied. The project directly benefited 165 HHs who receives emergency food kits. It also supported the hygiene necessities of 45 HHs. In addition, it also provided clean water to three communities who have lost access to safe drinking water.



---

**Construction of 5 Solar Powered Water Wells in Afghanistan**

---

The project aims at provision of safe and clean drinking water to 5 poor communities in three provinces of Kunduz, Baghlan and Parwan. The project will have long term impacts on the lives of the resident communities since it will help them have a sustainable water source close to their homes. The project is also using Green Energy (Solar Powered System) to provide power supply.



---

**Rehabilitation of Agho Jan High School in Ghazni**

---

The main objective of this project is to rehabilitate classrooms of Agho Jan high school to provide a safe learning space for students. The project team has planned to install a new roof for the school building, as well as install new doors and windows along with glasses for the classrooms. Moreover, some of the classrooms will be painted and cleaned ensuring a clean and safe learning environment for students.



---

**Provision of Winterization Kits to Vulnerable Families in Kabul**

---

The project's objective of the project was the provision of Winterization Kits to the vulnerable families to address the immediate survival needs of Vulnerable population to cope with harsh winter season to fulfil their needs through winterization assistance.

The expected result was that the vulnerable families will have been able to cope with the harsh winter season through the provision of Winterization kits during the months of Winter season. AFH was the donor of the project while the ORCD implemented the project in Kabul. Through this project Blankets, Children, and adults' sweaters for both female and male, Winter gloves, caps, Socks for children and adults were distributed among the vulnerable families in Kabul.
